KEY FINDINGS & RECOMMENDATIONS

TOP 5 EXCEPTIONAL CONCEPTUAL STRENGTHS:

1. POE's Rule of Sow And Reap (ROSAR) as Universal Constant
Score: 10/10 for Innovation
Impact: Transforms equality from abstract philosophy into mathematically stable, logically unified framework
2. POE's Symmetrical Polarity Construct (ASARC/DSARC Architecture)
Score: 9.5/10 for Structural Elegance
Impact: Perfect symmetry between equality and inequality progressions enables precise measurement
3. Capability Approach's "Equality of What?" Question (Sen/Nussbaum)
Score: 9/10 for Philosophical Depth
Impact: Reframed equality discourse from resources to what people are able to "do and be"
4. WHO's Multi-Level Determinants Framework
Score: 9/10 for Empirical Grounding
Impact: Exceptional causal mapping with evidence-based policymaking across sectors
5. Intersectionality's Multi-Axis Analysis (Crenshaw)
